Congressional Comment

Says Fight Impends Over Natural Gas

Rep. George A. Dondoro issued a statement today calling the attention of Michigan industries to efforts being made by retail gas companies and competing industries elsewhere, chiefly in Ohio, to secure control for their own uses of a very large part of the Texas and Kansas natural gas reserves on which our Michigan natural gas service is dependent.

For more than 12 years, starting in 1930, Detroit industries

and the City of Detroit have been campaigning for a natural gas supply to bring local gas rates down to a level comparable to those in Ohio. Now, even before such parity has been achieved, a plan is being submitted to the Federal Power Commission to build a large pipeline from the southwest fields, supplying southern Michigan, and dispose of such gas in the Cleveland and Pittsburgh areas as a permanent benefit to those areas, at the expense of southern Michigan, despite the fact that an alternate pipeline could be constructed from Louisiana.

Hearings on the proposal will be held by the Federal Power Commission at Washington, D. C., beginning Aug. 30. It is highly important that all industries in southern Michigan interested in protecting their present source of natural gas supply promptly make their views known to the Federal Power Commission, Washington, D. C., and to the Committee on Military Affairs of the U. S. House

of Representatives; the Hon. Andrew J. May, chairman, Washington, D. C., which is also investigating the pipeline proposal.

Rare-Type Deer Escape Their Pen

GLADWIN—A striking pair of pet deer—a jet black doe and a pure white buck—have escaped their pen on the Tom Linn estate in Gladwin county, and have eluded all attempts at re-capture, according to reports reaching conservation department officials here.

The deer, which were brought with another black doe and white buck by Mr. Linn, who lives in Detroit, to Gladwin county from Illinois, have been kept as pets in an enclosure on the Linn estate along the Tittabawassee river. Mr. Linn has requested the conservation department to caution hunters if the deer are open, to be on the lookout for the
