

Holiday Death Toll by Accidents Is 230 Per Day

Chicago, Dec. 21.—About 230 persons are killed every day between December 16 and January 3, the National Safety Council reported today. This estimate, based on totals for the past three years and present trends, includes all types of accidental deaths.

The Council announced the figure in connection with its Christmas Safety Campaign, urging public cooperation in reducing this annual holiday toll.

"This appalling figure means that the relatives and friends of approximately 3,700 Americans will have their holiday season blackened by accidental death," the Council's statement continues.

"It is hard enough to have such a toll in peace time, but in wartime it represents a carefree waste of vital national resources—man-

power. It also lets down our boys in uniform. They are out there fighting for peace and security of their home and ours. The less we can do back here to prevent careless accidents that destroy homes.

Most accidental deaths occur in homes, with an approximate 1,500 as an average for December 15—January 1.

One hundred and thirty other national organizations are co-operating with the Council and participating in the campaign.

"Public officials and organizations are cooperating all along the line in making this campaign successful, but only by the help of the individual citizen can we hope to lower this holiday toll," the Council says.

"If every person in this nation would realize that he has a war-time job of preventing accidents by using common sense, courtesy and caution, this accident toll would be reduced."
