

White Chapel Cemetery Opens A Local Office

White Chapel Memorial Cemetery has opened an office at 355 South Woodward in the Bloomfield Theater Building, in charge of William S. Merhoun as director of public relations. The floral window display has attracted considerable attention and another feature of the window will be a plaque containing "A Thought for the Week," the text of which will be supplied by the ministers of the local and adjacent areas.

White Chapel has grown steadily in recent years, with more than 10,000 lot owners now on its roll and its annual burials in the neighborhood of 1100. Mr. Merhoun states. A number of cemetery managers from other parts of the country have visited White Chapel during the past Fall to inspect the Temple of Memories mausoleum and the cremation facilities, which are offered in addition to the regular earth burials.

White Chapel has more than 100,000 visitors a year, Mr. Merhoun estimates, many of them attracted by the Spring tulip displays and the other floral exhibits which last until late Fall. The annual memorial service for the members of the Polar Bear Division, the North Russian expeditionary force of World War I, also brings a throng to the cemetery each year.
