IF you wish to Read Your Own METER THIS CARD MAKES IT EASY

To help conserve the nation's stock of automobiles, tires and gasoline, we are reading household meters and some commercial meters every two months instead of monthly.

For the month when your meter is not read, your bill is a payment on account. It is based on your normal use of service, and it enables you to keep your expenses budgeted on a monthly basis. When your meter is read the following month, your bill covers your actual use of service for two months less the amount you have paid on account.

Most customers find this plan convenient and satisfactory. A few have asked the privilege of reading their own meters in the month when our meter reader does not call. That's perfectly agreeable. If you would prefer to read your own meter, drop in at the office and we'll gladly give you some postcards like the one pictured here. They are already stamped and addressed, and it's easy to fill them out.

ONLY THREE SPACES TO FILL IN

Write your meter number in the space provided above the dial. You will find it on the meter face.

Show on the printed dial the position of the hands on your meter dial.

Sign your name and write below your address and the date. That's all there is to it.
