Food that "stand by" until noon are essentials, especially in war time, say home economics extension specialists at Michigan State College in passing along the following tips. Patties or breakfasts may not change much during the year, but the wintertime breakfast should whet the appetite, and the winter-hot cooked cereal helps the appetite. While what cooked in milk, or rice steamed with figs or dates and raisins, with the breads that range from toast, biscuits and muffins or corn bread, waffles or pancakes.

On the farm it's still the fashion to fry up some of the day's eggs scrambled with eggs. Most, if not every, cook will find some use for this portion of the meal.
