Pressure Cooker Procedure Told

Information has been received by Walter R. Cook, chairman of the Oakland County U.S.D.A. War Board, regarding applications for pressure cookers. The rationing of these cookers will be handled by the County Farm Machinery Rationing Committee and an advisory committee appointed by the War Board.

They have been released for Michigan about 8,000 pressure cookers. Since this limited number of pressure cookers must be utilized to obtain the greatest possible amount of home canning of non-acid vegetables and meats, preference will be given to neighborhood pools, organizations, or large families presenting plans for using a pressure cooker the maximum amount of the canning season.

Application forms are available at the County War Board Office and will be mailed to anyone requesting them. No consideration will be given to the canning of acid vegetables. All applications and requests for applications should be mailed to Oakland County U.S.D.A. War Board, 318 Hubbard Building, Pontiac.
