### War Expands Red Cross Office

ORDINANCE NUMBER 289  
AMENDMENT TO TAXICAB  
ORDINANCE NO. 174 OF THE CITY OF BIRMINGHAM, ALABAMA, AS THE "TAXICAB ORDINANCE" BY AMENDING SECTION 4 THEREOF.

The City of Birmingham Ordinance No. 174 of the City of Birmingham, Alabama, which is known as the "Taxicab Ordinance" shall be amended so that it shall read as follows:

(1) Each application for a license shall be accompanied by a cash policy of insurance for the maximum amount of \$100,000.00 for liability coverage specified for public liability, \$50,000.00 for injury to any one person, and \$50,000.00 for injury to any two or more persons.

(2) Such policy of insurance shall remain in force for the full period covered by license or any renewal thereof.

That Ordinance No. 199 be and the same is hereby repealed.

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and upon publication thereof.
