(Continued from Page 1, Part 2) on the ledge of the glass lid, place lid on jar, and tighten screw band firmly.

7. Processing. Always process immediately after canning. PROCESSING METHODS One of three methods may be used:

(a) Boiling water bath. (Best suited for processing fruits and tomatoes.) Be sure there is free circulation of water under, around, and over the jars. They should be covered with one to two inches of water during the entire processing time. Have the water boiling before placing the jars in the cans water boils vigorously. Be sure the water is kept boiling.

(b) Non-acid Vegetables. (The boiling water bath may be used for non-acid vegetables other than tomatoes) if a pressure cooker is not available provided that: (1) Vegetables are packed boiling hot. (2) Full processing time is given.

(c) Full circulation of boiling water around jars. (1) Water is at full boil every second of the processing time. (2) Entire contents of jar wrapped on it is turned out in a jar and boiled ten minutes before opening.

Only 2 of Thousand Casualties Lost

Less than two out of a thousand casualties in the South Pacific area of naval operations are proving fatal, the Navy's Bureau of Medicine and Surgery recently revealed. Of 4,000 land, sea and air casualties treated in the region, only seven died, establishing a record low mortality of 0.18 per cent. Sulfis drugs, the speed with which men are removed from battle zones, and the excellent care are contributing factors to the remarkable record.
