(Continued from Page 1) Chinese, unless given practically immediate aid by the United Nations with respect to arms and war equipment, may be forced out of the war in an active respect.

"The only unifying force in China at the present time is Generalissimo Chiang-Kai shek. China, if free and friendly, would present great opportunities for America. We must at once determine what our relations with them are to be and tell the average Chinese, or else he will withdraw in the belief that we may victimize him."

Another Forum speaker, Dr. Arthur R. Upgren, member of the Northwest Research Committee, recently known as the "Albert Lea Plan," whereby a Minnesota community—comparable in size and content to Birmingham—has accepted the responsibility for providing for their own retirement service men and women.

The Minnesota community has completely assessed and evaluated the entire real and personal property of the town to determine the prospective markets to be served and the increased demand for labor, it was accurately determined that by that town prospective employers would be in need of 8500 persons in various positions after the war, which would far more than absorb the returning soldiers.

"By this methodological approach, the complete human personalities of the town were checked," Mrs. Shain declared. "Experts were present for the see that the estimations were accurate. 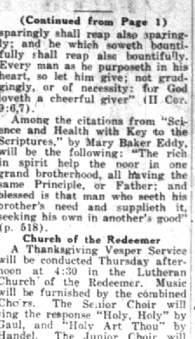
The Mystery of Swordfish Reef, by Arthur Unioid. Dark, complicated game-fishing party.
