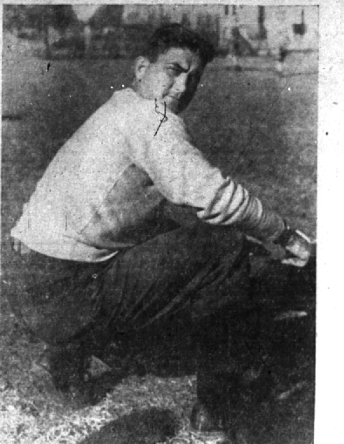

A Tough Job Faces Post Office Here's How We Can All Help

There's no assurance that Christmas packages mailed by Birmingham residents will reach recipients in distant cities by December 25th unless the parcels are mailed by the end of November.

And unless Christmas packages to nearby cities are in the mails by December 16th, it is doubtful that even these will reach their destinations on time.

Therefore Mr. Byrnes urges Birmingham residents to do their Christmas shopping early and mail immediately to facilitate the heavy volume of Christmas mail and to avoid delays or disappointments at the receiving end.

In a recent postal bulletin, Postmaster General Frank C. Walker points out that over 20,000,000 experienced postal employees have gone into the armed forces and have been replaced largely with much less experienced personnel; that transportation facilities ordinarily diverted to the handling of Christmas mail have been absorbed by the handling of the arm and equipment for the armed services, and that the ordinary everyday volume of mail has increased enormously.

To this huge everyday volume must be added the heavy Christmas mail, said Mr. Byrnes. "In order to facilitate the movement of all of it in the least possible time, so as not to overburden the existing postal facilities, there are many little things that Christmas

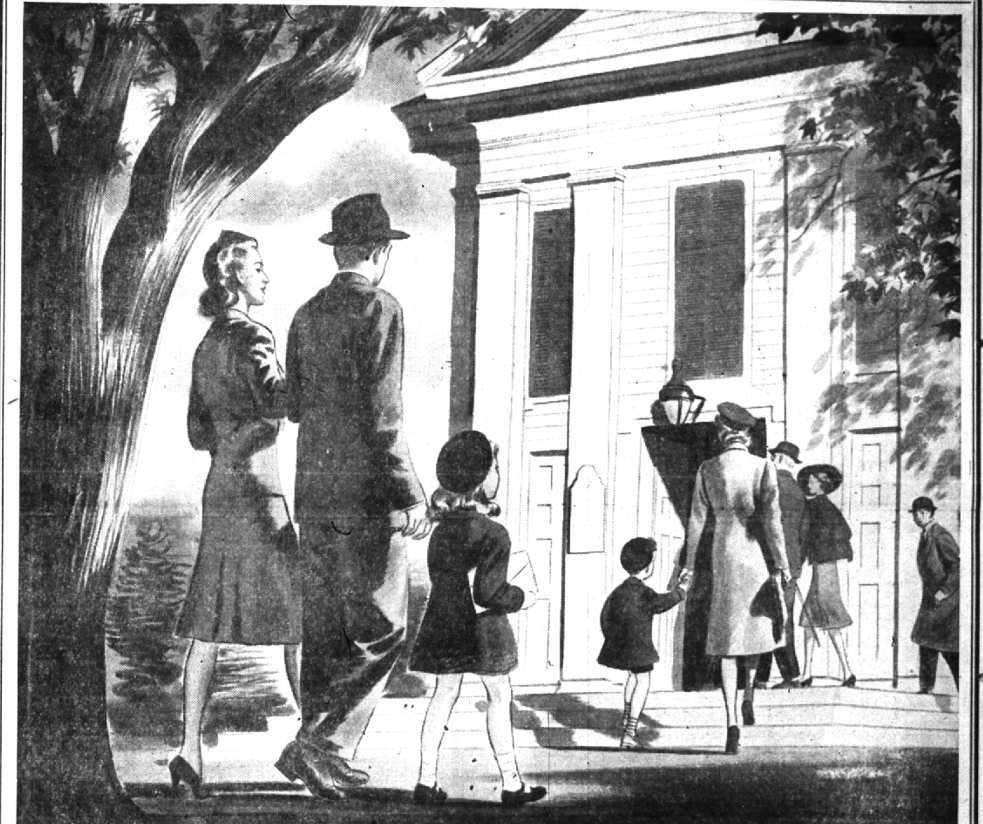
