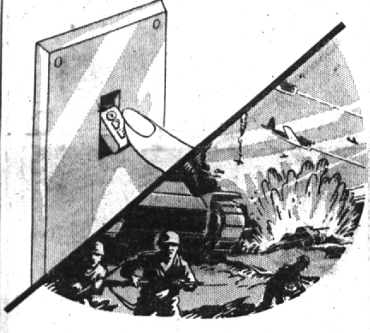

Former Greek Cabinet Member at Cass T.H.

Andre Michalopoulos, former member of the Greek Cabinet in exile, and president of the Anglo-Hellenic League, will speak at the Cass Town Hall Nov. 12 on "Greece—Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow." A Greek business man who entered government service under Prime Minister Venizelos, Michalopoulos saw action in both World Wars. He was most recently Minister of Information but resigned that post when he became convinced that he could accomplish more for his countrymen and the other oppressed peoples of Europe if he was not bound by the restrictions of an official position.
