## Pheasants and Ducks Around But Hunters' Numbers Drop 50%

LANSING, Oct. 27.—The hunters who braved snow and rain to open the small game season in the lower Peninsula found top-notch hunting on the opening week end, state conservation department officials report, but only about half as many hunters appeared as in 1942, which was a memorable pheasant season.

The timely arrival of cool fall weather in southern Michigan has helped in the bad an outlook of botulism, which state conservation department game men feared might seriously blight Michigan's duck population. The duck season opened Monday.

Early fall game surveys revealed large numbers of dead ducks in the Lake Erie marshes, although no dead birds were found in the Monroe marshes.

**Botulism Epidemic Nipped**  
Although botulism is frequently associated with low water conditions, this year's outbreak coincides with the unusually high water levels which flooded and killed great quantities of vegetation. Decay of this vegetation set up conditions where the botulism germ could operate.

The state conservation department's 1943 blacklist of persons denied the privilege of buying a deer hunting license this year contains 376 names. Last year's list named 232 persons.

A total of 141 of the 376 blacklisted persons were violators of the deer law, and 235 were persons who, while hunting, wounded or killed, by shooting, some human being. Fifty eight wounded themselves. This odd ratio of violators to persons responsible for accidents is the result of a 1941 change in the law that struck the names of many violators from the list.

Where once conviction for certain deer law violations automatically invoked the three-year ban on hunting, this penalty, which still may exceed three years, now must be specifically ordered by the court. In case of a violation of the small game laws, the court may order cancellation of the small game license for the current season and prohibit the purchase of a small game license in the next season.
