### RATIONING AT A GLANCE

Meats, Fat—Red stamps AS through Q8 are good indefinitely. Processed Foods—Blue stamps AS through RS, good indefinitely. Sugar—Sugar stamps 30 and 31, each good for five pounds indefinitely. Sugar stamp 40, good for five pounds of canned sugar through February, next year.

Gasoline—In 17 East Coast states, 20 coupons, good through May 8. In other states, A-11 coupons, good through June 21.

Fuel Oil—Periods 4 and 5 coupons, good through August 31. Shoes—Stamp 18 in Book One, good through April 30. Airplane stamp 1 in Book Three, good indefinitely. Airplane stamp 2 becomes good May 1 and remains good indefinitely.

To crush nut meats without waste, put them in a paper bag or waxed paper, then crush them with a rolling pin.

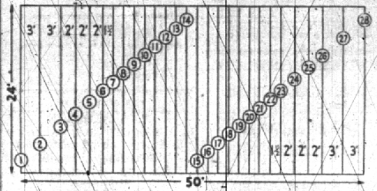
### Plan All-Summer Planting to Keep Victory Garden Soil Producing

A well-studied Victory garden plan should produce the following: 1—An all-season harvest, so far as possible, of all the vegetables grown. 2—Production of an abundance of every crop without wasteful surplus, which consumes space and work which could be devoted to needed crops.

3—Continuous occupation of the land, so that a maximum yield for the season is obtained. To prepare such a plan, a study should first be made to determine what vegetables the family will eat and put up for the winter. Don't grow crops which your family refuses to use.

Next, decide on the quantity of each vegetable needed, and the garden space required to produce it. Finally, for all which have a short harvest, total production must be divided into several sowings, so that one harvest will follow another, as the first is used up, or its quality falls.

Data for these calculations have been given in this series, and the practical application of them is illustrated in the plan which accompanies this article and the planting schedule which follows. Do not copy this plan and schedule, but make your own conditions in your garden and your own family preferences. In making your plan, adjustments are necessary, with a little more of one crop sown here, a little less of another there, at horticultural events can be foretold, this garden will produce a continuous harvest all season of the family's favorite vegetables, without waste surplus or avoidable scarcity, and no garden

- Row 1—Carrots, June sowing.
- Row 2—Green beans, June sowing.
- Row 3—Leaf lettuce, May sowing, follow with turnips for fall.
- Row 4—Cucumbers, June sowing.
- Row 5—Swiss chard, harvest all season.
- Row 6—Parsnips, all season.
- Row 7—Egg plant, 12 plants, all season.
- Row 8—Peas, follow with rutabaga, for fall harvest.
- Row 9—Carrots, follow with green beans for fall.
- Row 10—Leaf lettuce, follow with onion sets, for late green onions.
- Row 11—Green beans, follow with rutabaga, for fall harvest.
