NEW FOOD COURSE IS Being Offered at MSC

E. L. Anthony, dean of the school of agriculture at Michigan State college, has announced the establishment of a new course in food technology on the campus. The new curriculum, open to students at the beginning of the fall quarter on September 19, provides training in the technical phases of dairy manufacturing, handling and processing of fruits and vegetables, selecting, storing and processing meats, and in cereal manufacturing.

Preparation for certain kinds of food processing positions, said Dean Anthony, may be completed in four years. However, he added, students interested in the broad field of food technology should plan a five-year course leading to a master of science degree in food technology.

Students will be required to spend two summers or the equivalent of six months gaining practical experience in food processing or food manufacturing. They may enroll in the new course any quarter during the school year.

In the postwar period, Dean Anthony believes more persons will be needed with specialized training in the processing of foods, particularly in the dry and frozen food industries.
