AMMUNITION TRAILER
FORT WAYNE, DETROIT—As part of its enlarged heavy artillery and heavy ammunition program the Ordnance Department, Army Service Forces, is building a large number of 8-ton, 4-wheel ammunition trailers, Colonel Harry Adamson, commanding Fort Wayne Ordnance Depot, announced today. The new trailers are being used in combat zones three in tandem and will carry ammunition for the 155-mm "Long Tom" gun, the 8-inch howitzer, the 8-inch (200-mm) gun, and the 240-mm howitzer. The trailers are towed on roads or cross country by high speed trucks or tractors.

Red Cross To Assist Birmingham Families With War Casualties

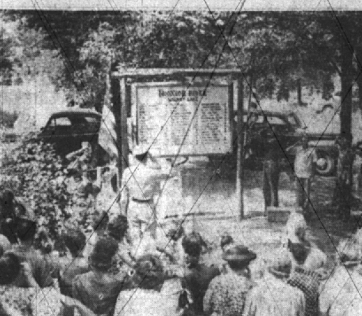
The War and Navy Departments are the only sources of notification on casualties and are most reported "missing in action," Mrs. P. P. Turner, home service chairman of the Oakland County Chapter, American Red Cross, announces in response to numerous inquiries from individuals in Oakland county.

"When a man is seriously wounded or critically ill, his family is notified immediately by the Army or Navy. This is likewise true of further information regarding his condition. Only if no additional report is received from military authorities within four weeks after the first official notification can the Red Cross attempt to secure additional information."

Should a man write that he is in a hospital and no official notification of his status should be placed at the intersection of Woodward and Walnut roads. The Red Cross will try to secure regular reports on his condition.

Again all information regarding men reported missing in action must come through official sources. Mrs. Turner stated. Available details are sent immediately to the families of these men but, frequently it is a long time before a report is available. Prisoners of war are reported through the International Red Cross in Geneva which in turn wires the families. No inquiries can be instituted through the Red Cross about men missing in action as it might jeopardize their safety if they are in enemy territory attempting to escape.

Get Winter Vitamin C In Canned Tomato From Your Garden

Get your winter supply of health-promoting vitamin C from canned Michigan grown tomatoes, picked at their prime, says Roberta Hershey, extension specialist in foods and nutrition, Michigan State college. From 20 to 30 percent of tomatoes or tomato juice should be planned for each member of the family.

Select firm, ripe tomatoes of medium size and uniform shape for canning. Do not use fruit that is spotted, decayed or badly cracked through spoilage organisms which are introduced that processing likely will not destroy.

Place the tomatoes in a wire basket and dip in boiling water for about a minute or longer if more time is required to make sure that the skins will slip easily. The water should be at least 180 degrees and core promptly. By handling only a few at a time one helps retain vitamin C that is lost when fruit is left out of jars for some time after being peeled. The best way to retain vitamin C is to handle only a few tomatoes at a time. Then after they are cut into quarters, heat them just to the boiling point, and pack into jars while hot. Most persons prefer the addition of a level tablespoon of salt to each quart. Process in the boiling water bath for 10 minutes.

In preparing juice, the skins need not be removed from the tomatoes. The fruit, however, should be washed well, the cores removed, and then cut into small pieces. Cook the fruit just under the boiling point or at a simmering temperature making sure that it does not boil. Put the hot tomatoes

Through a Fine Sieve and Reheat the Juice Just to Boiling before Pouring into Sterilized, Hot Jars. Salt in the Proportion of 1 Level Teaspoonful to each Quart of Juice may be Added. Partially Seal the Jars and Process in a Boiling Water Bath for 15 Minutes. Spices are Best Added after Serving; the Juice rather than during the preparation stage to avoid darkening the Juice. Miss Hershey suggests.

Copies may be obtained from your county extension office or from the Michigan State college bulletin office, East Lansing.

RATIONING AT A GLANCE

MEATS, FATS—Red stamps A8 through G8 and A5 through D4, good indefinitely.

PROCESSED FOODS—Bine stamps A8 through Z4 and A5 through F5, good indefinitely.

SUGAR—Sugar stamps 30, 31 and 32, each good for five months indefinitely, and 33 good for five months after September 1 and remains good indefinitely.

GASOLINE—1 "E" East Coast states, A-11 coupons, good through November 8. In states outside the East, 12 coupons, good through September 21.

FUEL OIL—Period 4 and 5 coupons, good through September 30. New period 1 coupons now good.

SHOES—Airplane stamps 1 and 2, good indefinitely.

OPA Changes Point Values
No more ration points for utility grades of beef and lamb will be required through September 2, and for the same period points have been restored on pork, hogs, pork hams and canned fish. The Office of Price Administration has announced. Changes were increased from two to four points for utility grades of farm or country butter from eight to 12 points.

Bloomfield Hills Teaching Staff Is Announced Today

A determination on the part of the Bloomfield Hills Board of Education to do everything possible to maintain and to even raise the standards of education in the district has resulted in certain significant changes for this year, Carroll M. A. H. W. superintendent, announced today.

The school year has been lengthened from thirty-six to thirty-nine weeks. Schools will begin on Sept. 5 and close June 15. Students are asked to report at 8 a. m. on Sept. 5.

Courses in Spanish, social geometry, dramatics, public speaking, citizenship and art have been added to the curriculum.

The staff has been carefully selected. Those added to the faculty this year are Edward Dekstra, who will teach science, mathematics, and boys' physical education; Glenn Wooster, to teach English, social studies, dramatics, and public speaking; Felix Wodan, teaching mathematics and boys' physical education; June Frederick, who will teach English, social studies, and girls' physical education; Hilja Lindes, teaching Spanish, social studies, and French and Civica Dittmer, who will replace Kathleen Wright in grades, three and four. Mrs. Wright has decided to retire after 26 years of teaching, 20 of which have been spent in the Bloomfield Hills schools.

Lucy Pursell, who has been assisting on a part time basis in the elementary grades during the past five years, will be employed full time this year. She will have charge of an expanded activity and physical education program in the elementary grades. Leota Potter, who taught music last year, will also teach art this year.

Provision has been made for an increase in the time available to teachers for work with individual students. A lower pupil-teacher ratio will also increase the opportunities for individualizing teaching.

Indications are that enrollment will be about the same as last year.

Birmingham Nimrod Vision More Ducks For Coming Season

Birmingham hunters are expected to be very much pleased with the announcement by the Nimrod Vision that more ducks will be available for the coming season. The Washington announcement says:

"Liberalized regulations for shooting migratory game in Birmingham announced by Justice Secretary Lewis, after which War Production Board courses estimated that about 90 per cent of the normal ammunition supply will be available for civilian purposes between now and Oct. 31. Last year the supply was about 75 per cent of normal."

Because the waterfowl population is on the rise, the season will be 80 days instead of 70. Amateurs will be allowed a higher daily limit of 10 instead of 8. The WPB sources say an order will be issued soon liberalizing the present limitation on civilian ammunition and specifying how much an individual can obtain.

Open seasons on wild ducks, ducks and geese will be Sept. 20-Dec. 31 in the northern tier of states, including Michigan.

Open seasons also will be announced for waterfowl, geese, woodcock and other migratory game birds.
