for the acceptance of such parcels for members of our armed forces overseas outside the continental United States.

The term armed forces overseas includes the armed forces who receive their mail through an APO or Fleet-post office in care of the postmaster at New York, N. Y.; San Francisco, Cal.; New Orleans, La.; or Seattle, Wash.; or an APO in care of the postmaster at Miami, Fla.; Presque Isle, Me.; or Minneapolis, Minn.; or through a naval installation stationing care of the postmaster of Seattle.

Mail Them Early
 Christmas cards and Christmas parcels for personnel of the armed forces overseas must be mailed during the period beginning Sept. 15, 1944, and ending Oct. 15, 1944, the earlier the better. The war department advises that Christmas greeting cards for soldiers overseas must be sent in sealed envelopes and prepaid at the first-class rate.

No requests from the addressee are required in connection with Christmas parcels mailed to army personnel during this period only. Patrons should endorse each gift parcel Christmas Parcel. Special effort will be made to effect delivery of all Christmas parcels mailed during this period in time for Christmas.

View of the urgent need for shipping space to transport materials directly essential to the war effort, Christmas parcels shall not exceed the present limit of five pounds in weight or 16 inches in length or 36 inches in length and girth combined.

Don't Send Food
 These departments have pointed out also that members of the armed forces are amply provided with food and clothing and the public is urged not to include such matter in gift parcels.

Not more than one Christmas parcel or package should be accepted for mailing in any one week which sent by or on behalf of the same person or concern to or from the same addressee.

Christmas parcels for members of the army personnel are leaving home stations en route overseas shortly before or subsequent to Dec. 15, 1944, will be mailed after Oct. 15, up to and including Dec. 10, 1944, upon presentation by the sender of address notification from the addressee received subsequent to Sept. 30, 1944, providing the parcels conform with prescribed limits of weight and size and are endorsed Christmas Parcel.

Only one such parcel will be accepted from any one person to any one individual having an overseas APO address.

Ladies Day's will be the usual Tuesday's and Friday's and the fair sex will be admitted to the grandstands and enclosures on those days upon payment of the 10 cent tax charge.

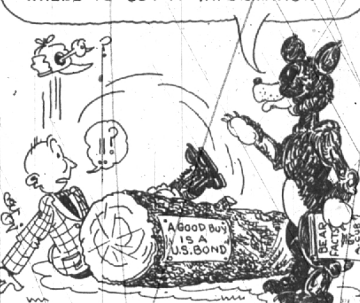
