Serve vegetables immediately, as over-cooking impairs flavor, texture, color, and destroys vitamins. Drain liquids taken from vegetables to use as sauces, vegetable cocktail, gravies and soups; they contain flavor and valuable food elements.

Other ways to economize in cooking:

1. Make sure that all burners on your Gas range are operating at their efficiency. Keep burners clean. No preheating is necessary. Gas produces maximum heat instantly.
2. Turn on a top burner ONLY when ready to place a utensil over it to start food cooking. Do not turn on a burner, then walk across the kitchen to get a saucepan.
3. DO NOT heat two quarts of water when you need only a pint or a quart. Heat only what is needed at the moment.
4. If your range has one giant burner, use it for large utensils of food cooking and boiling begins, turn this burner to simmer.
5. Turn off all burners as soon as you have finished using them—and this includes the oven burner when baking is ended and foods taken from the oven.
