Cpl. Stolberg Tells of Visit to Rome

Following is the second installment of Cpl. Thomas Stolberg's story about his visit to Rome where the Birmingham youth witnessed many interesting events and sights:

"After supper we went window shopping as most of the stores are closed in afternoon while the businessmen take a siesta, and we managed to find nothing worth seeing. The clerk in blacked out at night due to the lack of electricity so at dark we went to our room and piled into the first home last None of us could sleep as we were not used to bedrooms and soft beds but it was a pleasant experience, believe me.

The following morning we found much to our dismay, there wasn't any place where breakfast could be had, so off we went to the Red Cross for a cup of coffee and a roll, and by means of sweatier out a line, managed to get tickets on the Red Cross Tour which started at nine thirty. We were exceedingly fortunate in having a guide who spoke perfect English and knew the histories of the famous ruins perfectly.

We started out by first going to the Victor Emanuel Memorial and the Colosseum which we had already visited, but from there we went to the Church of San Sebastian and the catacombs built by the early Christians for refuge from persecution. There is a total of 25 different catacombs with a total length between 500 and 800 miles. San Sebastian was one of the most important Christians who died violently for his belief and the church was built in his memory. His remains are in a tomb under the altar as well as a statue of him carved in his position of death. The monk took us down into the catacombs where St. Peter and St. Paul had worshipped, and the small shrines are still there with the symbol of the fish inscribed on the walls. It is an amazing and impressive sight, but under the terrible conditions under which those people lived and died.

The catacombs are very cold and damp and blacker than anything you can imagine. We were all given small candles and the tour lasted only about ten minutes, but it was an education in itself. The story is that about twenty years ago a monk was exploring down there and directly under the church the tombs of both St. Peter and St. Paul were found. This must be true as the remains of St. Peter are now in St. Peter's church and St. Paul's are in St. Paul's church. Some of the bones of other people that died there are still to be seen and the names inscribed on the walls are still legible. Anyone who doubts the sincerity of those early Christians would do well to take a good look at what they endured.

From there we went to the Pantheon and this is probably the best preserved of all the ancient buildings. It was from the dome of the Pantheon that the huge dome on St. Peter's church was designed. The Pantheon, like some of the
