RATIONING AT A GLANCE

Meats, Fats—Red stamps A8 through Z8 and A5 through S5, used indefinitely. No new stamps until Dec. 31.

Processed Foods—No Friday, Dec. 1, five new blue stamps will be validated. Under the present system of making new blue stamps good on the first of each month.

Sugar—Sugar stamps 30, 31, 32, 33 and 34 each good for five pounds indefinitely. Stamp A9 good for 100 pounds of canned sugar through February 28, 1945.

Gasoline—AVI coupons in new ration book good for four gallons through Dec. 21. Fuel Oil—Period 4 and 5 coupons from last heating season, and period 1 coupons from new heating season good throughout year.

ent heating year. Period 2 coupons good in the fireplace on Dec. 11. Shoes—Airplane stamps 1, 2, and 3 in book three, good indefinitely. Point value for rationed goods, butter, margarine, cheese, canned milk, canned fish and processed foods will continue unchanged from November values during December. The Office of Price Administration points out. At the same time it was stated that December meat postage is expected to be about 5.4 per cent higher than last month, while the quantity of rationed meat is estimated at 1.3 per cent above November levels. The increases, OPA cautioned, are mainly in relation to the country's ability to consume.
