Catholic Camp Hard Hit By Sunday Fire

Fire at 12:24 p.m. Sunday did an estimated \$25,000 worth of damage to the Ukrainian Catholic camp, the former Edwin Bondy estate, at 3250 Walker boulevard, Waterford. The three-story structure, owned by Father Cheney of Hamtramck, is valued at \$35,000. Damage was confined mainly to the upper part of the building and much damage was caused by water. Cause of the blaze is unknown, but is thought to have started from defective wiring or chimney.

The camp, operated for both boys and girls, was being occupied at the present time by a group of boys who reportedly lost most of their clothing in the blaze. A group of girls arrived at the height of the fire for a vacation at the camp.
