Most Pros From Birmingham Area Will Play In State Golf Tournament Sunday

It is expected every professional from the Birmingham area will be in the state Professional Golf Association championship tournament on the Midland course next Sunday.

There will be no defending champion this year for Jimmy Demarest, former Flam Hollow, who now is serving with the U. S. Navy, won the title a year ago with 14 strokes on the final round to beat out Al Watrous, of Oakland Hills, by three strokes with a 142 total.

Jimmy won't be back, but in his place will be Sammy Byrd, of Plum Hollow, who recently set a course record of 64 at Bloomfield Hills. Claude Harmon, of Lechmore; Chuck Rikan, of Birmingham; and Ted Housh, Byrd's assistant at Plum Hollow.

On the basis of his showing thus far, Byrd will be the favorite. He is on a larger field than a year ago.

Increasing forest fire hazards in Michigan counties, result of recent dry weather, have lifted the season's total of fires to date to 771, or 48 more than were reported during the whole of 1943. Average loss so far this season totals 12,152 as compared with a 1943 loss of 18,063. Last week's loss, as reported by the conservation department, was 321 acres, with 59 fires reported.

While we have a beautiful library here in Pasadena, which I understand enjoys a high rating, it has been a great disappointment to me. The building itself is beautiful and at my first opportunity I shall send you a post card of it, but its contents, as far as I am not to be compared with your efficient and up-to-date library there.

On four occasions I have asked for reference books which should be in most libraries but they did not have them. On their open shelves in their lobby, labelled "Modern Novels" I find such things as "Lorna Doone—White Company—Little Women—Bella Donna"—the newest one seems to be about ten years old. Their books all look badly worn out. I miss your nice little library.
