Tuesday, August 15, 1944

To vote at this election, at which the question of ratifying an ordinance granting a franchise to Consumers Power Company will be submitted, all persons must be registered in the City by Wednesday, July 26, 1944 at 8:00 P. M. Eastern Standard War Time.

Citizens of the United States, 21 years old, who have resided in the State of Michigan six months and in the City of Birmingham twenty days at the time of voting are eligible.

TO REGISTER, call at the city clerk's office in the Municipal Building on or before Wednesday, July 26th, 1944 at 8:00 P. M. Eastern Standard War Time.

If you are now registered in Birmingham, but have moved since you last voted, you must transfer your registration to your new address by notifying the city clerk of such change prior to July 26, 1944.
