New Ceiling Price Lists Are Issued

The Detroit office of price administration has announced maximum prices on fresh fruits and vegetables to be effective July 5 through July 12 in Oakland, Wayne and Macomb counties.

Blackberries, including dewberries, have been added to the price list, selling at the maximum price of 45 cents a quart and 26 cents a pint. Red raspberries are selling for 45 cents a quart and 24 cents a pint, and the ceiling price for black raspberries will be 50 cents a quart and 32 cents a pint.

All cabbage has changed from 11 cents to 10 cents for the ceiling price; Cucumbers, except hot-houses, have changed from 10 1/2 cents a pound to 10 cents a pound, ceiling price on hot house cucumbers will be 20 cents a pound.

Leaf lettuce has dropped from 20 cents to 9 cents a pound and dry white onion (1944 crop) from 27 to 26 cents for three pounds. The ceiling on peas jumped from 15 to 18 cents a pound. Sweet peppers have been added to the ceiling price list, selling for 17 1/2 cents a pound.

mentioned by Mr. Mosher for instance were absolutely out of line with prices reported to have been said very recently by Mr. McAllister, to Mr. Osborne, for garage equipment.

We have a form, copy attached herewith, which we sent out to the larger owners of personal property and those with their main office out of town. In 1939 we tried sending forms to all owners of automobiles in the city but found that the owners of a small amount of personal property did not return them. Just what has offended Mr. Mosher, I can only guess. If I am correct in my opinion that Mr. Mosher does not really think that he is particularly abused by his assessment, then something else must have been said or done that has hurt his feelings. This is of course unfortunate. It certainly was not deliberate and I do not know what it is. He did say that the Board of Review was only in his building about two minutes. We were outside about fifteen and inside about ten to my best judgment. However, in his opinion we may not have given him the time he thought he should have been allowed. We did have other calls to make but had no intention of slighting Mr. Mosher.

Boy Scout bandmen have been invited to attend a four weeks course of instruction offered under the sponsorship of Wayne University during the four-week period of July 10 to August 4. The course will be personally conducted by Graham T. Overgrad, Wayne's director of music at the University band hall, 700 West Warren at Third. Rehearsals will be held daily on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays from 10 A.M. until 12 noon.

For several years the Scout Council has been considering the possibility of organizing a uniformed Boy Scout Band, 100 to 200 strong, which would be available a few times a year at special Council-wide activities. This summer course of instruction will be of immense value in preparing the Scouts for their first Fall or Winter official appearance.

Those Scouts whose applications are received and accepted by the University will also enjoy the experience of organizing a uniformed evening a week on which occasion noted musicians from the Detroit and Basin Symphonies orchestras will perform as soloists.

Any Boy Scout musician (except beginners, of course,) from any grade, intermediate or high school band or orchestra is eligible.

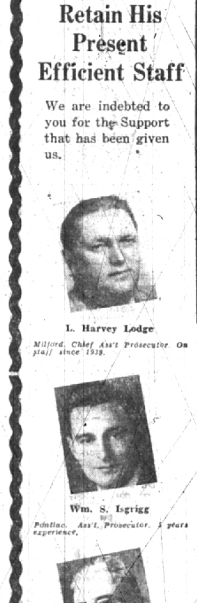
