

Hicks In Race For Congress

"If I am elected congressman of the 17th congressional district, I will do my best to cooperate with the policies of our revered president Franklin Delano Roosevelt, and our great Secretary of State, Cordell Hull, who sponsored my education and career as a young man in Tennessee when he was serving his state in Congress," is the message to the voters of the 17th district from John W. L. Hicks, Detroit attorney, and Democratic candidate for the office of congressman at the primary election next Tuesday, July 11.

Mr. Hicks is a native of the state of Tennessee, is 54 years of age, and a graduate of the Cumberland University at Lebanon, Tenn. He is a lifelong Democrat and during his early years his friendly contacts with Cordell Hull are said to have inspired him to liberal and democratic views.

Mr. Hicks has practiced law in Detroit for the past 28 years. His law offices are located at 18200 Grand River avenue, in the 17th district. Prior to his law practice he was a teacher in public grade and high schools for 11 years.

Mr. Hicks is married, and a taxpayer to the 17th district.

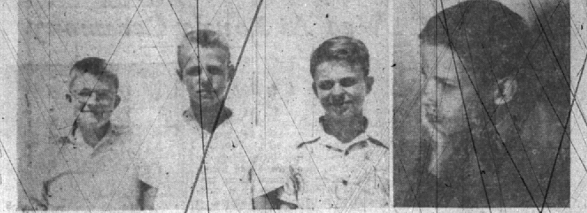
