

### Bass Fishing Is Reported Good On Nearby Lakes

There were not many Birmingham trout fishermen whipping the nearby streams the past week end. Most fishermen deserted the streams which usually yield speckled or brown trout and turned their attention to the bass and pike lakes.

**See Good Season**  
Local inland lakes have not been fished as heavily as usual in recent seasons, due to gasoline rationing and important business that has called a good many fishermen to the Far East and Europe.

Lake levels are relatively high. Last winter was mild and there was less "winter kill" of fish than the suffocated when thick ice and snow shut off the sun's rays and caused oxygen in water to become exhausted.

Also, warmer than usual temperatures of recent weeks have advanced the spawning season and most bass and bluegills were off the beds in southern Michigan waters for the past week.

**Safety Hints**  
Because drownings reduce the manpower potential, here is some advice:

Under no condition exceed the passenger capacity of the boat that is used. Do not use an unseaworthy boat. Do not go on the water when a storm is approaching or when the water is rough.

Do not wear boots or other hampering clothing when in a boat. Do not purposely rock a boat or permit any horseplay by other boat occupants.

If, unfortunately, a boat capsizes, stay with it. Secure a firm hand-hold and wait for help or drift ashore with the craft. If there are two persons in a boat that capsizes, they should hold hands across the bottom of the boat. Do not jump overboard to retrieve an oar without first

dropping anchor; the boat may drift away faster than its occupants can swim. Never stand up in a boat to hoist anchor, change position or cast. Do not put a large motor on a small boat. Carry a life preserver or buoyant cushion in the boat.

### JEEPS FOR FARM USE

The army jeep promises greater usefulness as an auxiliary work implement on a large farm than for general work on the average farm, according to indications reported by Domestic Commerce, official publication of the Department of Commerce. Tests have been made on jeeps at the Tillage Machinery Laboratory, Auburn, Ala., and in connection with Pennsylvania State College. Perhaps half a million jeeps have been manufactured and more will continue to be made until the war ends.

### School District Under New Name

"The School District of the City of Birmingham." That is the way the new name for the local school district and its new seal will read. The change over is being made as of July 1, when the new school year opens.

The old district, known as a "School District No. 1, Fractional, of Bloomfield, Troy, Royal Oak and Southfield Townships," will go out of existence, as far as its name is concerned, on the night of June 30. The old district was operated by a five-member board of trustees. The district will now be under control of a seven-member board of trustees, four of whom were elected recently.

The new board of seven members, meeting under the new district name, will hold its first session on Monday evening, July 10. It will first organize and name its president, secretary and treasurer and then participate in the annual Board District meeting at Baldwin High School building.

### Navy Is Calling For More Men For Radio Technician Training

Although over 900 Michigan men have passed the Navy Radio Technician Test to date this year, many more are needed to qualify for the valuable radio-electronics training, offered men who pass this test.

This was announced today by Lieut. Comdr. Byrd E. Flechner, officer in charge of Navy recruiting and induction for this area.

Men passing the test are eligible for a 15-month radio-electronic course which provides a good background for such promising post-war fields as television, industrial electronics and broadcast and aircraft radio.

The test is given at all lower Michigan Navy recruiting stations to men, 17 through 50 years old. Those in the 18-to-35 age bracket may take it if they are not deferred because of essential war work and have not yet received notice to report for their pre-induction physical examination.

There are no specific educational requirements for men to take the test. Most important is a sound knowledge of mathematics and physics.
