

State Masons To Aid Servicemen

Members of the Masonic lodge in Birmingham had a part in the raising of the \$30,000 servicemen's rehabilitation fund just set aside by the Michigan Masonic War Council.

"This money will be immediately available to provide assistance to wounded land needy servicemen and women," said an announcement made by William P. French of Ionia, a member of the Council.

The Masonic group also voted to contribute \$5,000 to the International Red Cross, exclusively for use overseas. "This makes a total of \$12,500 we have contributed for this purpose," the statement declared.

"On June 3, the War Council gave \$10,000 more to the Masonic Service Association, making a total contribution to this association of \$30,000, for the purpose of supporting the recreational and social centers maintained throughout the country for members of the Armed Forces," the report continued.

"There are three such centers in Michigan, located at Mt. Clemens, Tazewell and Battle Creek. Contributions have also been made to other organizations engaged in social and welfare work for those in uniform. The money for this purpose has been raised through voluntary contributions from Masons of Michigan."

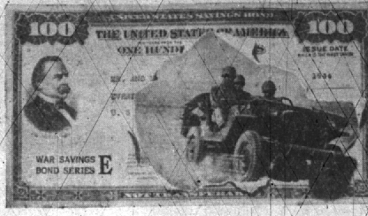
Anne Tracey Is In District Race

For twenty-seven years a resident of Oakland county, Anne Tracey, president of Big Beaver school board, has entered the race for state representative from the Third district on the Republican ticket. She has been a member of the Big Beaver school board for the past ten years.

"The problems she is most interested in and hopes to help secure if selected are:

"Soldiers' rehabilitation. According to reports, there are five hundred (500) shell shock cases a month, returning to Michigan," she said, "not all enough for hospitalization but definitely in need of help. Co-operation of Federal and State aid should be actively action at once for them.

"School funds should definitely be clarified and the present current settled. Home owners have shown they are reluctant to again risk the possibility of real estate taxes becoming excessive. When the sales tax went into effect it was not adequately take care of school needs. Liquor tax and race track tax likewise was to further make adequate school funds. Why it does not do so the people of Michigan are entitled to know.

Tests show that ONE-THIRD the vitamins in fresh vegetables may be lost through improper cooking before the food ever reaches your table. Your electric range can help conserve these important minerals and food values, and aid in the preparation of healthful meals for your family if you follow these simple rules:

- (1) Use little water in cooking. Half-a-cup is ample for most vegetables. Water-soluble vitamins are boiled away and poured down the sink when you use large quantities of water, wasting the very things you pay for. By steam-cooking vegetables, this loss is held to a minimum. Avoid the vitamin-destroying effect of the boiling process.
- (2) Avoid prolonged and violent boiling. The less time foods are exposed to high heat, liquid and air, the smaller the loss of their vitamin content. On an electric range, there is no large amount of water to be heated before the cooking can start.
- (3) Use covered utensils and do not stir. Air destroys certain vitamins, and stirring simply puts extra air into the food. Always use covered utensils when cooking on the surface units of your range.

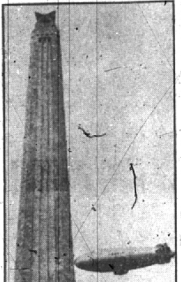
