

### Christmas Mail For Members Of Armed Forces Overseas Should Be Sent Early

In order that Christmas parcels may reach the addressee on time and in good condition, arrangements have been made by the Post Office Department in cooperation with the War and Navy Departments (the latter including the Marines and Coast Guard) for the acceptance of such parcels for members of armed forces serving outside the continental United States.

The term "armed forces overseas" includes armed forces who receive their mail through an A. P. O. or Fleet Post Office, in care of the postmaster at New York, N. Y., San Francisco, Calif., New Orleans, La., or Seattle, Wash., or an A. P. O. in care of the postmaster at Miami, Fla., Presque Isle, Maine, or Minneapolis, Minn., or through a naval installation or station in care of the postmaster of Seattle.

**Time of Mailing**  
Christmas cards and Christmas parcels for personnel of the armed forces overseas must be mailed during the period beginning Sept. 15, 1944, and ending October 15, 1944.

### Local Sportsmen Interested In Big State Land Auction

A lot of Birmingham hunters and fishermen, and sportsmen from this area have been displaying considerable interest in the purchase of state owned land in various parts of the state for private sports areas.

Auction sales of state-owned lands, including 18,473 acres, and 435 platted lots in 17 counties in the northeast section of the lower peninsula, are announced today by the conservation department.

Lands listed are wanted by interested persons, or their sale has been recommended by local municipal officers, land use planning committees, or the department. Former owners of these tax-reverted properties have 20 days in which to redeem them on payment of the amount of the high bid. The state reserves mineral rights and easement rights for public access to fishing waters across all frontage lands.

The following sales are announced:  
Harrison courthouse, June 26—2,939 acres, and 78 platted lots in Isabella, Roscommon, and Clare counties.

Gladwin courthouse, June 27—1,754 acres, and 46 platted lots in Gladwin, Midland, and Gladwin counties.

West Branch courthouse, June 28—2,829 acres, and 77 platted lots in Cheboygan, Arenac, Iosco, and Ogemaw counties.

Alcona courthouse, June 29—4,071 acres, and 102 platted lots in Alcona, Montcalm, Presque Isle, and Alpena counties.

Cheboygan courthouse, June 30—3,996 acres, and 110 platted lots in Cheboygan county.

Gaylord courthouse, July 1—2,884 acres, and 72 platted lots in Crawford, and Otsego counties. Sales are scheduled for 14 months after war time, except that at Harrison which will be held at 1 p. m. list of properties offered may be obtained from county treasurers or the conservation department at Lansing.

### Peach Crop Is To Be Very Heavy

Early peaches from ten southern states will be two and a half times as large a crop this year as in 1943, according to the latest crop report of the department of agriculture. Likewise, larger peach crops are expected in north central states, as Illinois, Indiana, Ohio, Michigan and Pennsylvania.

Government requirements of canned fruits from commercial canners will be 37 million cases this year, compared with only 22 million cases in 1943, the War Food Administration announces.

Canners expect to process 15 million cases of peaches, but of this 64 per cent must be set aside for government buying for armed forces and civilians, the WFA warns.

Home canning is the only solution this year to insure adequate and good quality fruit for the winter. Both canning supplies and sugar are available for home processing.

In addition to peaches now available for home canning, food stores carry apricots, berries, cherries and pineapple. Heavy government purchases of all these canned fruits will keep civilian supplies below peacetime levels, federal authorities say. Two-thirds of the pack of red sweet cherries and 60 per cent of the berries are to be set aside by canners for government purchase.
