### Red Cross Money Aiding Many U. S. War Prisoners

Supplies to prisoners of war is an outstanding achievement of the American Red Cross. For this purpose the national organization has allotted \$1,500,000, a part of the \$200,000,000 quota of the National organization in the March War Fund drive.

Prisoners of war are being aided by the Red Cross through the use of relief supplies provided by the U. S. government. It is estimated that during the year beginning March 1, 1944, relief supplies for 1,500,000 prisoners valued approximately \$9,000,000 will be provided and distributed under Red Cross channels.

Red Cross is aiding for \$200,000 this year. As more and more men go overseas the responsibilities of the Red Cross grow. "You Red Cross is at the side of your sons, brothers and husbands with its program of welfare, recreational and hospital services," said a campaign worker today.

"Red Cross has been charged by its Congressional charter to perform special services to able bodied and sick servicemen and their families and to meet this obligation it has been necessary to make the largest appeal for funds ever made in its history."

Contributors are asked to realize that this year their contribution is more than a membership in the organization. Previous years a dollar membership was considered adequate but this year is unprecedented in demands.
