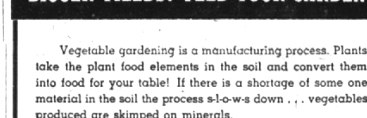

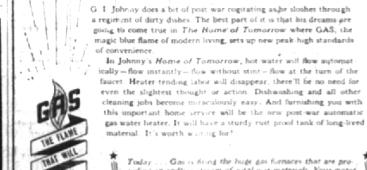

Four-Year-Old Son Honored on Birthday

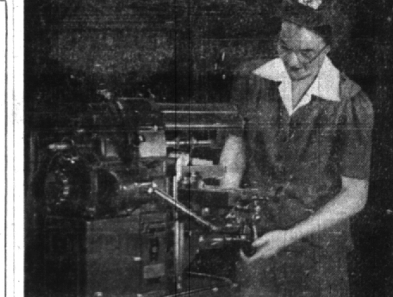
Mrs. Stewart Smith, of Willett street, entertained a group of children Monday afternoon, the occasion being the fourth birthday anniversary of her son, Marvin.
