

Cranbrook Sees Chance To Win Class C Title

The Cranbrook track squad raced through the regional championship meet at Ferndale last Saturday to win with 63 3/10 points, closest competitor being Algona with 55 1/10 points. Eleven Cranbrook boys qualified in fourteen events for the state meet at East Lansing next Saturday and hope to win the state title for class C schools. State records may topple two of the weaker spots for several of the Cranbrook stars have demonstrated the ability to better existing marks.

If Tom Frey's foot is in shape he is almost sure to set a new record for the 440 yard dash. Bill Kimmel has a chance to better the high hurdle time. Dave Walsh may step out the mile in better than record time and John G. Frey is likely to jump higher than any Michigan boy has ever done before in this competition. Tom Dickinson, speed merchant of last year's outstanding football team, is almost sure to set a new record for the 880 yard run as he has won every race he has entered this year and has never been pushed. Others who will make strong bids for wins and records at the state meet are Jack Unner in the mile and broad jump, Niles Severin and Jack Dye in the 440, Paul Fletcher in the high and low hurdles, Henry Whiting in the shot put, and Stan Bush in the broad jump.

Carl G. Wonnberger is head coach for the Crane track squad. John Dolan and Royal Schmidt are assistant coaches. They have been assisted this year by Tompkins Lickliter in the jumps, Paul Berger, shot, Harry Newman in the hurdles, Lew Dostkater at the middle distance runs and Bradley Patterson for the longer distances. William Heath has served the squad as recorder. Wendell S. Wilcox is the director of athletics at Cranbrook.

AN ORDINANCE RELATIVE TO SETTING OF FIRES
The Township of Bloomfield Ordains: Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to set a fire for the purpose of burning grass or disposing of refuse matter, or to burn any material within the period of March first and November first, and each and every year except the manner and under the conditions specified in this ordinance. Section 2. Any person desiring to set a fire for the purpose of burning grass or disposing of refuse matter shall file a written application with the township clerk or a majority of the township board of supervisors and township clerk or a majority of the township board of supervisors, under such conditions as they may prescribe upon application made in writing for that purpose. Section 3. Any person, either by himself, servant or agent, who violates any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall be punished under the Penal Code (Act 325, 1931) of the State of Michigan.
