League Of Women Voters To Study Tax Questions

Using the slogan "It's smart to know where the tax dollars go," the Birmingham League of Women Voters is initiating a tax study group.

The preliminary meeting will be held at the Community House at 10:30 a. m. Monday, Nov. 13, and the League states that all citizens who are interested in learning something about the tax situation in Michigan are welcome.

The purpose of the group is to give those attending the meeting an overall picture of taxation in the community and in the state.

A member of the League said today, "The League of Women Voters believes that Mr. and Mrs. Citizen can bring about improvement of tax laws by being informed of the tax situation. But such reform can only come if enough citizens become tax-conscious."

The tax study group will consider the following items during the course: difficulties of tax terms, taxes in the community, the property tax and finance administration, a study of state taxes and trends in federal taxation.

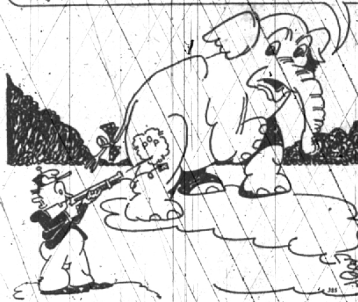
