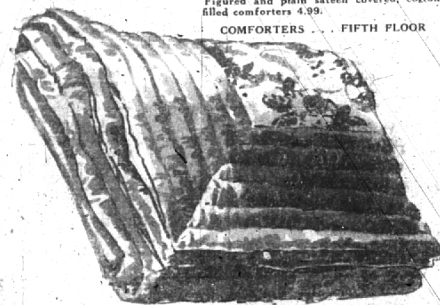

Religion School Planned for Fall

The Birmingham School of Religion sponsored by the six churches, First Baptist, Christ Church Cranbrook, Embury Methodist, First Presbyterian, and St. James along with the local Y.M.C.A., plans to have a fall session this year beginning October 23 and continuing for

six Monday nights, or until November 27.

The school will be held in the First Baptist Church as heretofore and it is expected that many church school teachers and other interested in the general courses will welcome this change from early spring to fall as the church activity year begins in the early fall.

Two general courses will again be offered. One on the "Life of Saint Paul, the Man and His Works" to be taught by Gen. Car-

hart of Pontiac and the other on "Reverend in the Church, Home and Community." The leader is being arranged for and it is expected that a number of young people from each church will register for this course.

For New Teachers

A course for new and old teachers and those who might be interested in teaching will be offered. This will cover ways of teaching, how to find and use source material, methods of class organization, how to interest class members in

participation, and various other teaching hints. This course is expected to draw a large group from each church.

A new course on "The use of the Bible with Children" will be given. The teacher of this course will be Miss Mary Anderson, the director of religious education in the Methodist church.

The Rev. Melville W. Crummett, new minister at the Baptist church will speak at the opening assembly of the school on October 23.

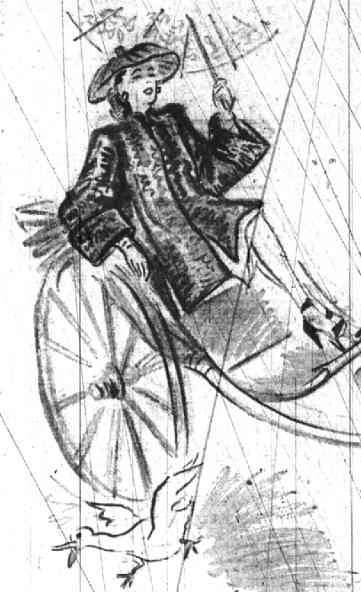
