Red Cross Ends Its Message Service To Soldiers Overseas

Emergency messages in servicemen outside the continental United States continue an important part of the responsibilities of the Home Service Department, Oakland County Chapter, American Red Cross but non-emergency messages now have to be ruled out.

"The volume of non-emergency requests reached such proportions that the more urgent messages were often delayed in transmissions from Washington," explained Mrs. E. P. Turner, Oakland's Home Service Chairman.

"Our national headquarters tell us that it cannot use Army and Navy radio for transmitting messages of a non-emergency nature," said Mrs. Turner.
