Trout Fishermen Fail To Agree On Season's Success

Trout fishermen, themselves must decide in retrospect how good or how poor was the 1944 Michigan season which ended Labor Day. Conservation department authorities say frankly that they do not know.

It is known that trout fishing was extremely good in some localities. A veterans guide on the Au Sable and Manistee says it was the best season in years and that he had only two days of rest while it lasted. Some anglers do not agree. Many Birmingham anglers had only fair success after trying a number of different streams.

Streams that could be reached easily from population centers were fished almost as heavily as in previous years. Heaviest fishing pressures, of all, however, were in downstate trout waters. The department's new Portage Creek pond near Jackson opened to controlled fishing for the first time this year, drew many anglers during the first weeks of the season and showed the way to similar postwar development of other downstate waters that are suitable for trout.

The open winter of 1943-44 helped trout and the department made heavy plantings of legal-size fish before and during the season. Consequently, unless there is heavy winter kill in coming months, prospects for next season should be good.

Comparatively few complaints concerning lack of fishing success were received by the department during the season. This may mean that more anglers had satisfactory fishing experiences. Or, it may mean that fewer trout fishermen than usual were trying their luck. The department says it does not know which explanation is the correct one.

License sales were above last year. War-occasioned help shortens handicapped the department in its efforts to obtain representative fish creel censuses.

In any case, the department knows some fish were there. If they were not caught, as good an explanation as any is that the war was responsible.
