Chocolate Chip Pudding
 1 cup shortening 1 cup oil
 1 cup sugar 2 eggs
 1 egg beaten 1 cup milk
 1 cup dark corn syrup 1 cup chocolate chips
 1 1/2 cups sifted all purpose flour
 Cream shortening and sugar. Add egg and beat until smooth. Scrape and beat thoroughly. Add the milk, beat again, baking powder and add to creamed mixture. Beat with the milk. Add chocolate. Pour into a 5x8x2 inch square pan. Bake in a preheated oven for 35 minutes. Serve with coffee.

KITCHEN CRAFT... Instead of scraping or paring roots, scrub them with a stiff brush. Besides being easier, this method saves the vitamins and minerals.
