

**Birmingham Makes Splendid Showing In Pontiac Meet**

In their first home meet of the season at Pierce Field last Friday, the Birmingham track team lost a hard-fought dual meet to a powerful Pontiac outfit 65-41. The local thirdeater, however, did much better than in last year's 77-27 defeat by Pontiac.

Pontiac took nine out of 12 first places, but the well-balanced Maple team took most of the runner-up places. Birmingham's firsts were won by Tom Zoellin in the high hurdle; Bill Old in the quarter mile; and Tom Woodhouse, Don Buell, and Stan Schaefer who tied the high jump.

Bill Old led the Maples in scoring with his first in the 440 and second in the broad jump. Close behind was Bruce Sander, who took second in both the 100 and 220 yard dashes and third in the broad jump.

Vern Keebaugh was outstanding for Pontiac winning the low hurdles and broad jump, and taking second in the high hurdles. Hester copped the dashes and ran a fast anchor for Pontiac's winning relay team.

**Cranbrook Wins First Track Meet**

In their first track meet of the season Cranbrook school won from Bloomfield Hills High School last week 64 to 40. It was a close race much of the way with the winners taking all three places in the mile and high jump and winning the half mile relay.
