Comedy Precedent Is Set By Ergasterion's Latest Play

Humor and fast action were the outstanding characteristics of the 17th annual Christmas show which was given by Ergasterion in the Grandbrook Auditorium last Friday and Saturday nights. "The Case of the Comical Corpse," a mystery farce in three acts, was written by Terence Jerome and Helen Vonnor and directed by Carl G. Wonnor.

Following the usual custom, a double cast was used again this year, with the exception of a few students who played the same parts on both nights. The three lead parts, enacted by Bob McGregor, Elaine Newhall and Charles Stuart were exceptionally well done. All three showed remarkable stage presence and dramatic ability.

Action Is Amusing. The action of the play takes place in the main hall of a castle in the Colorado Rockies. While its owner, a political aspirant, is out of town on business his substitute publicity agent is left in charge of the castle. He is joined by his ex-wife and her fiancé, Joseph Dolma. The latter two are writers, and by the young agent is written the biography of his employer. Sadly in need of funds, Mr. Dolma begins to hire out the rooms of the castle to travelers who are

caught in a snowstorm. The collection of characters who come to the door, and their actions, furnish amusing episodes throughout the play. Two of the guests turn out to be gangsters with a corpse on their hands. The hiding of the body and the eventual writing of the blame for the murder upon the owner of the castle provide the comedy and climax of the performance.
