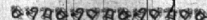

It is a Study Group. According to Mrs. Howard J. Liverance, local president, the League is a non-partisan organization of women voters devoted to the study and discussion of current issues. It works as a unit, nationally, to further a program of legislation in the public interest.

Birmingham League meetings, held regularly on the third Monday of each month at the Community House, are always open to visitors. The year's local project is a study of government in Oakland county, particularly a study of the health situation. The findings of the committee in charge of this study, headed by Mrs. W. B. Mansland, will be incorporated in a survey to be written in layman's language and to be distributed to League members.

Seek Slum Clearance. At present Birmingham members are writing to Senators Homer Ferguson and Arthur H. Vandenberg to urge their support of Senate Bill 1892 which makes federal funds available to help communities in slum clearance; encourages private enterprise to meet the tremendous housing shortage; assists communities to provide public housing for low income groups; and establishes a unified housing agency in the federal government.
