SYNTHETIC RUBBER. How does synthetic rubber compare with natural rubber? Will it be "but on the shelf" as a discarded war emergency material when real rubber is once more available? Not at all. Used in insulation for wires and sheathy for cables, some synthetic rubbers are better than the real thing. They are unaffected by conditions which cause natural rubber to deteriorate, our Research Laboratory finds. They do not crack or check in sunjight or under exposure to the ozone generated by some high-voltage electrical equipment.



SUGAR SAVER. If you are short on sugar, try this recipe from our Home Service Department:

Maple Syrup Cake

 $\begin{array}{lll} 1~\rm egg & 2~\rm tbsps.~melted~shortening \\ 1~\rm cup~maple~syrup & 15 \\ 15~\rm cup~milk & 15 \\ 1~\rm tsp.~avanilla & 15 \\ \end{array} \begin{array}{lll} 2~\rm tbsps.~melted~shortening \\ 15 \\ 15~\rm tsp.~salt \\ 15 \\ 15~\rm tsp.~baking~powder \end{array}$

Beat the egg thoroughly; add the maple syrup, then the milk, vanilla, melted shortening, and lastly the dry ingredients sided together. Beat thoroughly and bake about 45 minutes in a moderate oven -375° F. — in a deep loal-cake pan, preterably of the tube variety. Frost with maple frosting and descorate with talved walnuts or pecass, or sprinkle chopped must over the Tosting before it sets.



OUT OF MIND. Because house wiring is buried in the walls, out of sight, it is usually "out of mind"—and little understood. But don't think it isn't important! It carries the 'life blood' of the modern house—the flow of electricity. And just as a too-small pipe can lessen the flow of water in your plumbing, so can a too-small wire choke off the flow of electricity. Don't deny yourself enjoyment of dozens of postwar electric appliances because of inadequate house wiring. If you are planning a new home, be sure your wiring is large enough to allow full use of tomorrow's electrical living.


