Such right is merely a phase of the play of free competition among ideas, and it is in this way that they attain a state of civilization. Without such right, the citizen would be reduced to a state of savagery. The processes of law would be impossible without such free expression; the technique of education would remain in a groove of ignorance without free discussion and studies; and science, without the right to experiment would never have been developed.

Some people believe that the right to speak and write should be in some matters withheld from people in a democracy; they, therefore, for example, that those who are Communists or Socialists, should not be allowed to speak or write their ideas. This might overthrow the American way of life.

Some folks argue that certain newspapers and magazines, certain radio programs, should not be allowed to offer information and entertainment because they do so merely for profit. Well, to set up controls over these problems would be, in effect, to give the government regulatory powers that, placed without stop where they were, would be a "benevolent tyrant."
