Wallace O. Leonard, of 1023 Yarmouth road, Birmingham, has been named as one of the organizers of the move to organize a state bank in Pontiac.

He is president and general manager of the Wilson-Fordney & Machine company, was formerly with the Reconstruction Finance Corporation and for some time served as assistant to the president of the Federal Reserve Bank in Cleveland.

It is said the full amount of the \$200,000 capital, \$50,000 surplus and \$50,000 unwithdrawn profit has been subscribed. Applications for permission to organize the bank has been made with the state banking commission in Lansing.

Receipts of tin cans to be detritors and shredders for the calendar year 1943 were 256,953 tons and 117,829 tons through August, 1944.

Adjusted receipts on purchased iron and steel scrap by consumer mills was 28,495,000 net tons in 1942 26,205,000 tons for 1943 and 18,019,000 tons through August, 1944.

Receipts of waste kitchen fats, as shown by reports from the renderers and collectors, were 30,093,776 pounds in 1943, 36,135,150 pounds through June, 1944.

Mill receipts of waste paper of all types were 6,065,417 net tons in 1943, and 5,267,630 net tons through September, 1944.
