We had a good time eating chicken, Mexican style, and seeing square miles of henequen for making sisal and rope, Yucatan's Green/Gold. Henequen leaves sell for 25 cents a thousand leaves. They are about 3 feet long by 5 inches wide. A thousand is about half an American freight car full. I think at 25 cents a thousand!
