## Retailers Are Campaigning to Make Quota

Retailers of Birmingham will take an active part in a statewide emergency drive to help put Michigan over its E bond quota for the month of July. Loan E was announced by F. E. Quisenberry, local chairman, Birmingham chairman for the Michigan Retailers War Savings Committee.

"Frank N. Lacey, Michigan War Finance Committee Chairman and J. B. Webber, Jr., state retail chairman, have appealed to us to participate in a special drive to sell fifty thousand \$1000 E bonds in Michigan," said Mr. Quisenberry. "Every mall store is asked to assume the responsibility of buying or selling at least one \$1000 series E bond by Saturday, June 30. According to records, there is over \$1,600,000,000 in savings accounts in Michigan. This is an impressive estimate showing that there is at least a quarter of a billion dollars in savings accounts in Michigan. \$200,000,000 of so-called 'mattress money' is hiding. If only one cent of that over two billion dollars in ready cash in Michigan were invested in Series E bonds, it would amount to \$200,000,000."
