There Is Still Time To Plant Vegetables In Victory Garden
"Grow while you can and eat what you grow" was the warning issued today by John F. Gaffil, Chairman of the Birmingham Victory Garden committee as evidence mounted that the country is facing its most critical food shortage since the war began.

He stressed that it is not too late to plant a garden. "There is still sufficient time to have a very good garden which will produce many crops suitable for canning and preserving," he said. "There is a special need to plant some tomatoes, snap beans and carrots. In view of the meat scarcity it is also advisable to plant such crops as edible soybeans, lima beans, snap beans and—where space permits, navy beans. By sowing the seeds in July a fall crop of peas can be grown. These crops will help materially to furnish the nutrients necessary in our diets, if supplemented with milk or other animal products.

Gardeners who want advice on what to plant, how to plant it and what to do with the crops when they are harvested can obtain it through Mr. Gaffil.

"Every ounce of food that can be produced in a home garden should be produced," Mr. Gaffil said. "Make sure that no vegetables or fruits go to waste. These foods not eaten fresh should be preserved. Those gardeners who have been tempted to give up because of the discouraging weather must not do so, those who have not started a garden should do so, and all should get capacity production from their gardens. That's the only way we can be sure of having an adequate supply of the right kinds of foods for our families."

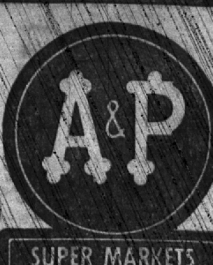
