War Relief Work Of 1st Church of Christ, Scientist, Is Mounting
 Mrs. Trueman F. Campbell, chairman of the war relief committee of First Church of Christ, Scientist, of Birmingham, reports that more than 3,000 pieces of clothing, bedding and other articles have been sent to their general headquarters in Boston during the past five years, for shipment to war sufferers abroad. The local committee meets every Tuesday from 10 to 4 o'clock in the Sunday school room of the church edifice, located at the corner of Chester and Willis streets.
 Those who wish to donate garments, or other articles to the committee or to help with the work, are invited to call the chairman by telephone, Birmingham 3,003. At this time there is a critical need for infants and boys' clothing. All used garments, which are washable, should be so handled and sent or brought to the work rooms at the above address.
 This local committee is one of more than 1,000 units in the United States which is preparing materials for shipment to sufferers in the war torn countries. As a result of this united effort more than 3,000,000 garments have been supplied to civilians who have suffered as the result of the war, and are in addition 400,000 knitted garments have been furnished to men and women in the armed services.
 Since the beginning of the war, materials have been distributed in England by airplanes supplied by the churches and in the two months of December, 1944, and January, 1945, 300 cases have been sent to Norway, 100 cases to France, 82 cases to the Netherlands, 62 cases to Russia, 50 cases to Greece, and 28 cases each to Belgium, Czechoslovakia, Italy and Yugoslavia.

Holy Name Church Plans Services For Coming Holy Days
 Holy Name church has completed plans for its services during the remainder of Lent and for Easter Sunday.

 The Mass of the Holy Eucharist on Holy Thursday at 8 a. m. will be closed by Procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the Repository.
 Mass of the Pre-sanctified will be offered at 8 a. m. Good Friday. The three hours observance in church will be marked by public meditation on the seven last words from 12:30 to 2:30 conducted by the Rev. Edmund Fournier, professor at Sacred Heart Seminary, Detroit.
 The liturgical brilliance of the Masses on Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday will manifest the joy of the Resurrection—Christ's triumph over death.
Royal Oak Choral Union Concert To Be Given April 24
 The annual concert by the combined Choral Unions of Royal Oak, Windsor, and Detroit will be presented on the evening of April 24 in the auditorium of the Royal Oak High School. The oratorio chosen for this concert is the Mendelssohn "Elijah."
 The combined choruses will number approximately 250 voices and they will be accompanied by an orchestra of 27 pieces, all members of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra.
 An additional feature of the oratorio this year will be the use of a narrator who will read quotations from the Bible to help tie the various musical episodes together and thus give the audience a more comprehensive story of the life of Elijah. The narrator will be the Reverend Alvin Morris, who is moderator of the Detroit Presbytery.
