Registration will be received at the office of the Board of Education in Hill school building.

The office will be open from 8 a. m. to 5 p. m. on weekdays, except on Saturdays when the hours are 8 a. m. to 12 noon. On June 2 the office will be open from 8 a. m. to 3 p. m.

For a vote in a school election a person must be a citizen of the United States, 21 years of age, must either own property or be the parent or guardian of a child between the ages of five and nineteen, and be included in the census of the district.

To Elect One Member—The annual school election will take place on Monday, June 11. Only one member of the Board of Education will be elected. The term of Ernest W. Seakins expires this year and the election is for a period of three elections. The present board consists of seven members, two elected each year.
