The hard-running Cranbrook led from the second event, and Birmingham was unable to catch them until the third successive defeat. However, with Chuck Adams jumping through 5 ft. 6 in. and Bill Old jumping 20 ft. 4 1/2 in., the Maples slammed both the high jump and the broad jump, giving them badly needed points.

Maples Beaten In Pitchers' Battle

In its first away game this season last Friday, Birmingham was defeated by Port Huron 4-0. Port Huron pitcher Lew and George York pitched four innings in 94-0 game study of game allowed only four hits, no runs, and one walk.

As the Maples were leading by four points both weeks needed a first in the pole vault to win.
