Study of Road Needs of This Area Ordered

The Birmingham City Commission today pledged to a quick study of the future highway needs of this area, and particularly of transportation needs into and out of Detroit.

Attention of the Commission was called to the need for quick action by Lloyd Reed, former Birmingham resident and now on the highway planning board of Detroit.

He urged that needs of adjacent communities in connection with this route, be studied immediately and such locations as are agreed upon should be included in the state highway commissioner within two or three weeks.

It was explained by Mr. Reed that the Commission must make a heavy increase in automobile travel as soon as the war is over.

A date for the conference is expected to be set this week and a group of mayors and city managers asked to attend the session.

The Oakland County Board of Commissioners also will be asked to attend the session and to present its proposed north-south express highway.

The City Commission also studied requests for re-zoning for the area between Bowers and Haines streets.
