

Wilford B. Russell Is Taken By Death

Wilford B. Russell, 765 Ham street, died May 20 at Highland Park General Hospital following a short illness. He was born in Ann Arbor township May 30, 1872, and attended school in Litchfield, Mich. He graduated from the Engineering School at the University of Michigan and on Oct. 15, 1921, he married Edith Apple in Ann Arbor. They moved to Birmingham from Syracuse 15 years ago.

Mr. Russell was the vice-president and chief engineer of Peerless Cement Corporation. He was in the navy during the last war. Mr. Russell was a member of the Masonic order, the American Society of Civil Engineers, the Detroit Engineering society and a past president of the Michigan Engineering Society. He belonged to the Birmingham Country Club and the Red Run Golf Club.

Victory Garden Chairman John Gail said today, "Nearly one thousand plots will be planted to storage crops and near-by vegetables this spring. He estimated that more are needed. A large garden plot is not necessary for a victory garden. Flower beds or a graded strip of land in any back yard is sufficient to produce beans, corn, onions, or a bushel of potatoes that may mean the difference between enough to eat and short rations this coming fall and winter."

To assist late gardeners the Victory Garden Committee will endeavor to find plots for those who want them. They are asked to call 1230 and leave their name and address. Those gardeners who are anxiously waiting to have their land plowed are asked to be patient as the long wet weather has delayed plowing.
