FAR EAST AIR FORCES. Manila—First Lieutenant Robert C. Stevens, of Birmingham, Mich., is completing processing at General George C. Kenney's Far East Air Forces' 22nd Replacement Depot, prior to being returned to the United States under the readjustment program. His wife, Mrs. Helen M. Stevens, has been residing at 412 North Lincoln, Bay City, Mich.

A veteran of 10 months overseas service, the 24-year-old lieutenant wears the Air Medal, the Asiatic-Pacific Ribbon with five campaign stars and the Philippine Liberty and Independence Ribbon with one star. He was assigned as a pilot with the 63rd Troop Carrier Squadron of the 13th Air Force.

Before entering the service in August, 1942, Lieutenant Stevens was employed at a club. He was graduated from Baldwin High School in Birmingham.
